# **ANNUAL REPORT 2023**

### A Message from the Director

2023 saw a change in both the direction and the directorship of The Hague Peace Projects. Our long journey through the peace landscape has seen our 'Changemaker' days evolve and culminate this year in a return to our core strength: **peace through dialogue**. In retrospect, dialogue has been the common theme throughout our activities since the beginning. The knowledge and expertise that we have gained along the way have all been acquired through talking and listening, and through these honest conversations we have grown.

We now find ourselves playing an increasingly important (and challenging) role providing context and balance to mainstream narratives on global and domestic conflicts. Our 'Time to Talk' series of weekly interviews continues to unveil the stories behind our conflicts, offering critical information that is unrepresented in Western mainstream media and political discourse.

Ours stories compete against a background of political, economic, and racist bias entrenched in our institutions and media, with the West's complicity and trivialization of the ongoing genocide in Gaza serving to highlight the deep crisis in Europe and America's information diet. In this sense, not a lot has changed since the Vietnam war.

Our investment in dialogue seeks to achieve sustainable peace and conflict resolution through a process of understanding and reciprocity, yet must do so while contending with a warmongering West whose militarization ambitions align with the alarming upsurgeance of extreme right in Europe.

Today, 'the honest conversation' faces an increasingly binary narrative from a privately-owned media landscape which perpetuates cycles of propaganda towards escalation and readily invests in conflict resolution by force. Through dialogue, we hope to counter-balance this selective exposure that ill-informs Western society and its institutions. Our weekly videos attempt to unravel the battle of narratives by having honest conversations, and steadily expose information that is crucial to this balance.

We believe an accurate representation of facts and exposure to knowledge is critical, such that a healthy and well-informed civil and political discourse may be equipped to achieve peace through consensus one day. It is through this process of knowledge gathering and understanding that we aim to encourage civil and political society to properly consider what is necessary to break our cycles of war and conflict.




The first event in our 'Time to Talk' series. We invited prominent figures and speakers to share their expertise and concerns regarding the escalating war in Ukraine and engage in a public debate on the route to peace and diplomacy. This event was made possible with our cooperation with the Oranje Fonds and their support of our 'Freedom Sessions' initiative.

This event focused on the war in Ukraine which had been going on for almost one year. Tens of thousands of people had already died in the bloodiest conflict on the European continent since World War II. Both Russia and Ukraine, with its Western supporters, seem to think only in terms of military escalation. Increasingly heavier weapons and bloodier tactics. Knowing that multiple nuclear-armed militaries are involved in this struggle raises the very concerning question: where will it all end? Are politicians today aware of the ultimate disastrous consequences of a constant cycle of escalation?

It is high time that we give diplomacy a new chance before it is too late. Every conflict, even this one, needs to end at the negotiation table, preferably sooner than later to save human lives. But how to get there and build a peace movement to prevent further escalation and push for peaceful solutions to this conflict?

### STOP THE WAR

Marking the start of our 'Time to Talk' series, the StopTheWar.nu website was launched as a platform to support peace and follow its dialogue via weekly interviews with prominent thinkers and experts. The platform provides an alternative to the dangers of selective media exposure to the rhetoric of warmongering and posturing that further escalate armed conflict.

#### With this initiative, we aim to:

Abandon the policy of escalation and actively seek a diplomatic solution to the conflict in Ukraine, for example by setting up a national advisory committee to advise on possible diplomatic solutions to the war.

Make efforts at EU level to appoint an EU peace envoy who will explore the possibilities for a diplomatic solution with both Russia and Ukraine.

Use the influence of the Netherlands in the EU to organize an international conference between all warring parties, including Russia, the US, Ukraine, NATO and the EU, in which agreements can be made about a common, permanent and sustainable security framework.

With Russia's invasion of Ukraine underway for almost a year and a half, it seems in all likelihood, that more than a hundred thousand people have already been killed in a conflict that is already the bloodiest on the European continent since the end of the Second World War. Millions of Ukrainians are fleeing, and the humanitarian consequences of this war are becoming incalculable. In the meantime, the relationship between the West and Russia continues to worsen with a mutual escalation in their war rhetoric and investments giving reasons for grave concerns for the whole international community.

## NL Election debate - Peace in Ukraine -

About 80 visitors sat on the steps of Leiden University in The Hague to listen to the vision of our political leaders. They felt the politicians reasoned one-sidedly from the perspective of arms deliveries, while they had been asked about their proposals for achieving peace. There was disappointment with the lack of knowledge about diplomatic options, such as the influence of the BRICS countries, China's 12-point plan, Saudi Arabia's interventions, etc. Moral arguments seemed completely absent from Dutch political decisions. Eventually, a proposal arose for an informative conversation behind closed doors between the peace movement and interested MPs about conflict mediation.

The 'Time to Talk' series reflects The Hague Peace Projects' belief that dialogue is the route to understanding our conflicts and breaking the cycles that perpetuate them. It is humanity's only tool for achieving real sustainable peace.

These videos show us how critical it is to peace that we never forget the importance of talking, the inclusivity and honesty of which determines our ability to understand, de-escalate, and prevent our conflicts. The interviews represent a concerted effort to encourage dialogue and provide a platform for the human relations and rights that grow from it. It is our hope that through the earnest efforts of a well-informed and inclusive civil society, that real non-violent, political, social, and environmental transformation can be achieved.

For this to be possible, it is crucial that mainstream information exposure is well-balanced in terms of (freely) offering multiple perspectives and informed journalism, as opposed to selective and biased towards political and economic interests which typifies the bulk of the Dutch media diet today.

These videos, therefore, serve to provide a much-needed balance to the diversity, quality, and honesty of information which is freely available to civil society and the public of The Netherlands and abroad.

## **CLOSING STATEMENTS**

### **Looking Ahead in 2024**

2023 was a year of talking and marked a new focus for our contribution to the public good: peace through dialogue. We have learned more this year than any of the preceding, simply due to the number of people we have talked to. People from different backgrounds with different perspectives, all of whom own and form parts of the stories that enrich and broaden our truths.

2024 promises an even greater need for these voices to counteract a worrying escalation in global unrest. Tensions are evident all around the world but nowhere are they clearer than in Gaza, where the West's participation in genocide can no longer hide in the pages of history books. Anno 2023, and the world's largest concentration camp can be viewed live on our screens - only you will have to visit non-Western media to see this.

The painful hypocrisy of the West's condemnation of Russia, yet support of Israel, has unmasked any illusion of their peaceful intentions. For the world outside their borders, and according to the UN, the West are war criminals, and with its escalating militarization, growing inequality and right-wing extremism, fears of direct confrontation between global superpowers are becoming more realistic by the day.

The denial of the West has found refuge in its expanding crusade for war, with demonisation instead of diplomacy as its favourite weapon. Its neo-liberalism failings have found a friend in the military industrial complex and see a vast game of profits to be played for. The failure of our democracies to govern for its people has ushered in a new wave of fascism throughout Europe, seeking to distract discontentment with war and oppression.

The current rate of escalation bodes nothing good for next year. And though all is eventually solvable by dialogue, it looks likely that peace will continue to suffer before the conversations we need to have are possible. 2024 may just be the quiet before the storm.
